



WHAT ARE THE KEYSTONE EXAMINATIONS?

The Keystone Examinations are state mandated, end of course tests, intended for students to demonstrate proficiency in the core subject areas of English Language Arts, Algebra I, and Biology. The Keystones are given in December and May. The results are posted to the students' transcripts.
