Contract:

Grade Point Resources (Rebecca Moyes) and Shaler Area School District

The parties agree to the terms and conditions listed below:

1.1 Scope of Service and Costs: Rebecca Moyes will perform the services described in Exhibit A. Shaler Area School District will perform the services in Exhibit B.

1.2 Costs:

Contract is for the following services: consultation and training, for functional behavior assessments as requested, and for consultation regarding individual students.

\$70 per hour (hours requested by the school district and upon availability of consultant). (Exception: In-service trainings are \$500 for half day and \$800 for full day and are in addition to the above.)

1.3 Payments: Shaler Area School District will make payments according to the following schedule:

A. Invoices:

- 1. Shaler Area School District will make payment on invoices presented by Grade Point Resources for Rebecca Moyes by the 15th of each month beginning in December 2016 and concluding in July 2017.
- B. Invoice Limitations: The following restrictions limit Shaler Area School District's obligation to pay invoices:
 - 1. Shaler Area School District is soley responsible for payment to Grade Point Resources/Rebecca Moyes. It is not the intent of Shaler Area School District and Grade Point Resources/Rebecca Moyes to create third party beneficiary rights in these entities.
 - Shaler School District will not make any deductions or withholdings from the compensation
 paid. Shaler Area School District must issue all forms required by federal and state laws for
 income and employment tax purposes upon signature of this contract.
- 1.4 Contract Terms: Contract shall commence upon signature of this agreement and terminate July 31, 2017.
- 1.5 Applicable Laws/Choice of Law/Venue: Grade Point Resources/Rebecca Moyes must observe and comply with all applicable laws and regulations. This Contract is executed in Allegheny County, Pennsylvania and is governed by the laws of the State of Pennsylvania. Any action arising out of this Contract must be filed in a state court or federal court located in Allegheny County, PA.
- **1.6 Status of Contractor:** Rebecca Moyes is an independent contractor, and no relationship of employer-employee exists between Shaler Area School District and Rebecca Moyes.
 - 1. **Insurance:** Grade Point Resources/Rebecca Moyes will carry professional liability insurance in the amount of \$1 million.
 - 2. **Waiver of Claims:** Shaler Area School District waives any claim against Grade Point Resources/Rebecca Moyes for damage or loss caused by:

- (1) Any suit or proceeding directly or indirectly attacking the validity of this Contract or any part of this Contract.
- (2) Any judgment or award: (a) declaring this Contract, or any part of this Contract either void or voidable or (b) delaying the performance of any part of this Contract.
- (3) Damage to its property, equipment, or facility (due to negligent, accidental acts or omissions)
- (4) Injury to students, their parents, or siblings for the same throughout the duration of this contract. Grade Point Resources/Rebecca Moyes will not engage in physical restraints or other means of hands-on techniques or de-escalation strategies with students.

Alteration: No alteration or variation of the terms of this Contract is valid unless made in writing and signed by both parties.

- **1.7 Time:** Time is of the essence in the performance of each of the provisions of the Contract. Waiver by either party of any provision of this contract by either default, breach, or condition precedent will not be construed as waiver of any other duty or right under this contract, including those waivers related to time.
- **1.8 Severability:** If any provision of this Contract is held invalid or unenforceable, the invalidity or unenforceability will not affect any other provisions of this Contract.
- **1.9 Entire Agreement:** This Contract constitutes the entire agreement between Grade Point Resources/Rebecca Moyes and Shaler Area School District. Both parties revoke all prior or contemporaneous oral or written agreements between them that are inconsistent with the terms of this Contract. In the event of any dispute between the parties regarding the Contract, this contract will be deemed to have been drafted by the parties in equal parts so that no presumptions or inferences concerning its terms or interpretation may be construed against any part of the Contract.
- **2.0 Communication:** The following are terms listed to communication between the parties.

- **3.0** Authority to Bind: The persons signing on behalf of the parties to this Contract warrant that they have the legal authority to execute the Contract.
