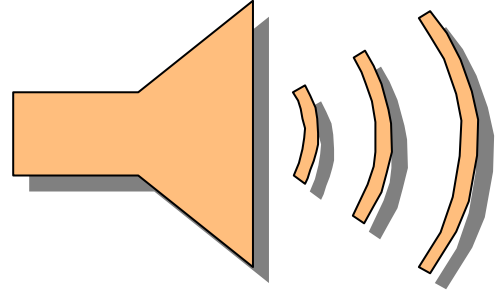


HIGH SCHOOL ANNOUNCEMENTS
