Diversity Day is on March 28<sup>th</sup>. Middle and High School Youth Advocacy League students will be co-facilitating discussion groups with our MS students. The Creative and Performing Arts (CAPA) High School students will perform monologues; *Arts in Activism throughout History and Today*. These presentations are designed to educate the audience on past movements for equality, and use this knowledge to create a conversation on how to create change.
